The inaugural whisky tasting evening was a resounding success and thank you to members Paul and Jina Phenix who arranged for the event to be held at The British Club and to The Club staff who made sure that the attendees were well fed and lubricated. Not forgetting a thank you to the Whisky companies who were most generous with not only their product samples but their explanation of the story behind the various brands being tasted.

The two claimants to the invention of whisky are The Scots and The Irish although they did not invent distillation ie using heat to separate liquids into component compounds as most likely it was the Ancient Greeks who got there first. Interestingly, distillation was refined in the middle ages by polymaths such as Al-Razi with the word alcohol being derived from the Arabic "Al -Kuhl", any comment would be superfluous. Returning to whisky, the earliest documented records for distillation activities in Ireland and Scotland are in 1405 in The Annals of Clonmacnoise and in 1496 in The Exchequer Rolls of Scotland respectively although this would not have yet involved the mellowing of product in wooden barrels. Various spirits were produced in both Scotland and Ireland but it was not until a Royal commission published in 1909 stated that blends could be classed as whisky and in 1915 the Immature Spirits (Restriction) Act declared that the spirit must be matured in oak for a minimum period of three years to be classed as whisky. Mines a Cardhu!!

THE CONSULAR SECTION OF THE BRITISH EMBASSY

Greetings once again!

Let's start with some stats. Here's what kept Bangkok Consular team's operations busy in July.

We provided 110 notarial and documentary services, printed 39 Emergency Travel Documents, and dealt with 157 emergency Consular cases. These cases included deaths (65), welfare issues (27), hospitalisations (28), arrests and detentions (15), victim of crimes (6), child welfare (5), and missing persons (11).

The number of enquiries regarding missing person has increased recently. If you come across similar situation, please see the <u>Getting help if someone goes missing abroad guide on GOV.UK.</u> The guide provides useful information about what to do when you want to report a missing person.

Additional to office operations, we did some engagements with Thai authorities.

Consular team members met Marine department to discuss marine safety ideas and potential collaboration. The team also attended Tourist Police Diplomatic Volunteer Training hosted by Tourist Police and joint by other 21 embassies. It was a good opportunity for Consular team to build network between diplomatic missions across Thailand with the aim to support one another and enhance Thailand's tourism security.

A new UK government brings new rules and legislation. Here we take a look at some of the main pledges made by Labour.

Pensions

Labour will retain the valuable triple lock for the state pension. They also stated that they will adopt reforms to ensure that workplace pension schemes take advantage of consolidation and scale, and will undertake a review of the pensions landscape to consider what further steps are needed to improve pension outcomes and increase investment in UK markets. Labour did announce that they will not reintroduce the Lifetime Allowance but will instead leave the current regime in place for the time being until the planned review is complete.

Non-dom status and IHT

Labour have made it clear that they will abolish non-domiciled status ('non-dom'). This will only affect a small number of individuals across the UK, but they tend to be some of the wealthiest. Domicile is a concept that does not exist in most other countries' legal systems, which tend to only recognise residency. Residency is where someone is physically located in any particular vear and is based on a number of tests including amount of time spent and ties to the country. Domicile can best be understood as someone's ultimate home, or the place to which the person will ultimately return. Labour have also pledged to end the use of offshore trusts to avoid UK inheritance tax (IHT). These are known as excluded property

trusts - they are typically created by people

Taxation

Labour have made it clear they will not increase National Insurance, the basic, higher, or additional rates of Income Tax, or VAT. As such they will need to draw on other sources of potential revenue such as Capital Gains Tax or the Oil and Gas levy. These will be published in due course. Labour have stated that they will end the VAT exemption and business rates relief for private schools to invest in state schools, which could mean that private schools may increase their fees.

Corporation tax

Labour will cap corporation tax at the current level of 25% for the entire parliament and will act if tax changes in other countries pose a risk to UK competitiveness. This will be welcome, as Corporation Tax was raised to the current level by the previous government, from a prior level of 19%.

Mortgages

One of Labour's statements in their manifesto was to be tough on government spending rules in order to keep mortgages as low as possible. Their plan is to create a permanent, comprehensive mortgage guarantee scheme in order to support first-time buyers who struggle to save for a large deposit, with lower mortgage costs.

With a new government in power, we could see more legislative changes in the coming months and an interesting Autumn Statement delivered by the new Chancellor Rachel Reeves.

The Australian Women's Group, The British Women's Group, the Royal Varuna Yacht Club, and the Bangkok Amateur Dramatic Society (fore-runner of the Bangkok Community Theatre). As recorded below, the St. David's Society in Bangkok joined them during the year, to add to the existing loyal societies of the Bangkok St. Andrew's Society, the Bangkok St. George's Society, and the St. Patrick's Society Bangkok.

In 2005, the Club's Constitution was formally amended to give a legal status to community groups as 'Associated Groups' and the 'Loyal Societies'.

Sporting Matters

The inaugural Thai Glass-Gestetner Trophy, an Annual Eclectic golf tournament, was played in the first quarter of 1976. In the April, we have the first record of the Golf Section playing the Ladies Golf in a tournament called 'The Kitchen Sink' to win and hold the 'Frying Pan' trophy!!!!

In the March, at the annual Tennis Championship, a number of the trophies were renamed or re-presented. Fleming Kinnaird donated the Kinnaird Cup for the



Ladies Single Championship winner, as in 1975, Colleen Perry had won the old Ladies Singles Cup three times in a row and got to keep the trophy.

In the May, the Club hosted a special event with the Bangkok Aquatic Club to celebrate the American Bicentennial event. This was due to the BAC having lost the use of their own pool in Sukhumvit.

The immediate past Chairman, Lt. Col. Hugh Docherty OBE, donated a Plate for the Ladies Doubles competition and the Men's Doubles Cup was referred to as 'The Spink Cup' for the first time. It is assumed that the Cup was donated by Mr G.R. Spinks who went on the Absent List in 1973.

The British Club will meet the Bangkok Aquatic Club to mark the American Bicentennial Celebrations, on Saturday 1 May and Sunday, 2 May. The meet will be held at the British Club pool because the BAC have lost the use of their facilities at Soi 71. Starting time: 7:30 A.M. on 1 May. The regular Monthly Gala which had been scheduled for 2 May will be postponed to another date, to be announced later.

Management Matters

The first occurrence of the year was that our Club Manager, Mr H.A. Traugott, resigned after eight years' service ... Mr. Traugott's record long service was not exceeded again until 29th October 2020, when Khun Premrudee Tanyaluck broke the record as our longest serving Club Manager!

Mr. Traugott was replaced by Club Member Lt. Col. John F. Davis, temporarily pending his retirement from the Army. Then, uniquely, Mr. Davis took over also the role of Club Secretary as well as being Club Manager, thus ending a history of over seventy years of Honorary Secretaries. The officer role of Honorary Secretary was not filled again until the year 2000.

Service

The committee of 1976 was again stable. Mr. Nigel Overy, a six-term Committee member, took over as Chairman (see Past Particle, March 2023). Mr. Charles S. Stewart was again Vice-Chairman (see Past Particle, August 2024). As reported above, there was no Honorary Secretary appointed, and Mr. John Mumby completed

his two terms of service as Honorary Treasurer, and Mr. Blaise McConnell completed his two terms of service this year.

Mr. John P.D. Gandy served part of this plus two other terms, and upon leaving the Committee in March, was replaced by Mr. Brian Heath returning *[see Past Particle, July 2024]*. Another 'new boy' serving the first of three terms was D.J. Graham MC, and two, who served twice, were Mr. Geoff S. Smith and Mr. M.F. de Vries.

The final "new boys" were Mr. James Davidson and Mr. R. Willmott-Pilgrim who both served this term only.

Club News

In the February, the Annual General Meeting agreed to the setting up of a 'Long-Range Planning Committee' to set up a list of all works for facilities that Members wanted, then create a priority plan for their implementation.

Although there had been intermittent colour television in Thailand since 1967, the first full colour service on all three channels (4, 5 and 7) did not start until 1976. In the March, the Club Committee decided that we would rent a set (at a massive 700 Baht per month) and that it would be put in the 'Cinema Room' (now the Suriwongse Room) to allow children to watch it with a separate aerial placed in the 'Reading Room' (now the Pool Room) for when adults wished to view it privately!

Richard Willoughby Wood was an Upcountry member of the Club for many decades, residing in Chiang Mai, and in the summer of 1976, he presented the Club with a 1909 photograph of the Bangkok Lawn Tennis Club 'Championships of Bangkok': this picture, on display in Veranda, shows H.R.H. Crown Prince Maha Vajiravudh assembled with all the players and BLTC members. The Crown Prince had actually donated the Men's Singles Championship Bowl for the tournament. In 1910 the Crown Prince became H.M. King Rama VI, in 1914 he donated the Clubhouse land to us and in 1919 we purchased the Bangkok Lawn Tennis Club as our present poolside.

OUTPOST

In the November, the General Committee had received appropriate letters of liability from four airlines, whose cabin crew could now use the Club as 'visiting members': These were British Airways, Cathay Pacific, Qantas, and Tradewinds Airlines.

Although the Club was now operating at a slight cash surplus each month there was still an underlying concern that membership was not improving. The 1975 tinkering with eligibility rules (see Past Participle, August 2024) had done little to grow membership which had, in fact, floundered to 399 by the year end. A working party was thus set up to re-examine bringing in non-British male members ... but more on that next month

In Other News

In the April, the St David's Society in Bangkok (Cymdeithas Dewi Sant Bangkok), a social group for Welsh people, was founded, with Eric G. Howells as its first Bard. Their honours board was duly commissioned.

Also, in the April, the Telephone Organization of Thailand upgraded all five- and six-digit telephone numbers in Bangkok to new seven-digit numbers with 02 being additionally added as the Bangkok area code. The Club's number of 30247, first issued in 1948, became (02) 234 0247. It should be noted that 0-2234-0247 is still the Club's number, 48 years later

The British Embassy roles of Air Attaché and Naval Attaché were merged in 1976, and Cdr C.G. Roberts RN became the first British joint Air & Naval Attaché in the May and joined the Club in the June.

The Bangkok inner ring road, under construction since 1971, was finally completed in 1976 ... its name, Ratchadaphisek Road, comes from its original purpose to celebrate the 25th anniversary of H.M. King Rama IX.



Royal International Club, Château Sainte-Anne, Brussels

Visited May 2023 by Paul Doust and Prasit Jangkamol (a.k.a. Jack)

The idea for Royal International Club arose around the time that the Treaty of Rome was signed in 1957, when Brussels became the home to various European institutions. The Chateau Saint-Anne estate on the edge of Brussels was deemed an ideal location, and the club was founded in 1959. Besides diplomats, European officials and international executives, the club also welcomes numerous Belgian families. King Philippe of Belgium, who sometimes visits with his wife, is a patron of the club.

The club has two distinct areas, namely the Château Sainte-Anne itself, and the sports area located behind the château. The sports area has 3 tennis courts, a 25 metre swimming pool, a multi-purpose room for group exercise events, and is where the poolhouse restaurant is located. The château and the sports area are separated by a gate, and an access card is required to pass in either direction. The château is used for the club's events, and also has restaurant and bar areas which are open at lunchtime on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays only. During the pool season, which runs from late April to early October, the poolhouse restaurant is open for lunch every day and for dinner on Fridays and Saturdays. It offers a "brasserie" menu, suitable for the whole family. The dress code in the château is business casual, so men are required to wear a shirt with a jacket but a tie is not necessary. However, the sports area and poolhouse restaurant has a casual dress code. The club has no accommodation.







On a trip to Belgium last year, we had time to visit the club with some Thai friends, so we had lunch in the château on a Friday. We had a lot of luggage with us, but the staff were very helpful in helping us store it all in the cloakroom. After we'd looked round, we settled in for an excellent 3 course lunch which cost us €40 per . The restaurant's wine list was very small, but vintages were specified and the wines had been well chosen. We ended up choosing a delicious 2015 Saint-Émilion priced at €44, which seemed good value for a smart restaurant . On the day that we visited only one other table in the restaurant was occupied. but there was an event taking place on the upper floor of the château, after which lunch was served for the people attending the event in the room adjacent to the restaurant.









Aspria Brussels Arts-Loi

It's true that this club is slightly out of the way for anyone visiting central Brussels. If British Club Bangkok members just require sports facilities, our club is reciprocal with a couple of Aspria gyms which are located in the city centre. One such gym is the <u>Aspria Brussels Arts-Loi</u>, and during this trip I popped in briefly to have a look at it. It's a fine gym, but in some ways it's an unusual club to have on our reciprocal club list because that's all it is, so it's like being reciprocal with e.g. a Virgin Active or a Fitness First gym in Bangkok. The <u>Royal International Club</u>, however, is a lovely venue away from the hustle and bustle of the city. The château restaurant in particular is well worth a visit for anyone who wants a decent lunch

SECTION UPDATE:



"Blockchains: Already transforming our World": 1st August 2024





















Financial Technology Expert Eetu Kuneinen started from first principles and lead the very attentive audience into the world of Blockchains. Starting from the founding of the concept in 2008 through how they work, the various current applications, the benefits and challenges, then he moved on to future trends and innovations. Eetu suggested that Banks globally should in particular be concerned as to the massive impact that blockchain technology is and will have on their longstanding business models.

There were numerous questions, all very well answered in Eetu's laid-back and professional style, before Chairperson Terry Adams brought the long presentation to an end, but people were reluctant to leave the room, instead prevailing upon Eetu to respond to even more questions!

EVENT REPORT:

"Cardiac Cath Labs: Revolutionary Future of Heart Care": 15th August 2024

Seniors Section Committee Member and leader of our Lifelong Learning programme Barbara Meynert introduced our Speaker Bruce Hemmingsen, himself a Seniors Section Member despite working in a very senior regional role for a leading medical equipment supplier.

Supported by superb slides and graphics, Bruce firstly described in detail using an excellent video, how the body's blood circulatory system interacts with the heart to continuously pump blood through our bodies. All attendees must now be in no doubt as the to marvel that are our heart muscles, pumping so very often and regularly throughout our lives!

He then moved on to describe and show real Cardiac Cath Labs as are currently used in hospitals around the world (which includes Thailand where a number of hospitals are using such high tech equipment). He then touched upon the procedures that are performed in Cath labs before describing the most common heart diseases, and showed slides depicting how these are treated in Cath Labs. These included coronary angiograms, coronary angioplasty, TAVR (Transcatheter Aortic Valve Replacement), pacemakers, then on to the use of catheters, guidewires, balloons, and stents.

There were numerous questions asked and all were well answered by Bruce. One not unsurprising fact was that, given the cost of a Cath Lab as being between US\$ 1.5 to 3mn (depending on the numbers of 'bells and whistles' provided - the writer's term not the speaker's), plus the cost of numerous items of support equipment and necessary consumables, meant that the cost to the patient for an operation was very much at the high end at present, but that favourable outcomes were very much enhanced.

This was a fascinating, thoroughly engaging, and informative presentation of interest to all.






