

It seems like yesterday that the 2023/2024 budget was agreed and signed off by the General Committee and here we are already in the final month of the current financial year and preparing for the new one that commences on the 1st December, 2024. The budget for next year has been agreed with the focus remaining on general improvement of service and offerings across all outlets, value for members and cost controls.



**Assistance Case Types** 



In what can be a confusing (and sometimes treacherous) landscape, Martin Wright, Senior Financial Planner at Progeny outlines investment options for British expats.

#### **Banks - Offshore**

There are still many deposit takers providing offshore bank accounts, including the overseas arms of major UK financial institutions. Certain locations use the UK bank clearing system meaning there is a UK sort code which include Jersey, Isle of Man, Guernsey, Gibraltar and Malta. Each location has its own financial services compensation schemes offering various degrees of financial protection in the event of bank insolvency.

Sourcing systems such as the offshore tab of the moneyfacts.co.uk website can be useful to source competitive interest rates. Given the apparent reducing interest rate environment bank interest rates are likely to reduce from the highs of the last few years. Interest from offshore bank accounts is often paid gross without any tax deduction at source.

#### **Banks - Onshore (Thailand)**

Some major global banking institutions have closed their Thailand operations in recent years although there still remains UOB and CIMB banks. There are also well-established local banks like Siam Commercial Bank, Bangkok Bank and Kasikorn Bank.

Local interest rates tend to be lower than those in GBP and USD. Interest received from local banks is subject to withholding tax at a flat rate of 15% although Individuals may choose to exclude interest income from other income and pay tax according to the Thailand Personal Income Tax rates instead.

#### **Directly held investment funds**

This includes Mutual funds, Unit Trusts and OEICs. Mutual funds are investments made from pooled money from investors and can include bonds and equities as well as other asset classes. A unit trust differs from a mutual fund in that a unit trust is established under a trust deed, and the investor is effectively the beneficiary.

Two of the most common types of funds in the UK and parts of Europe are unit trusts and open-ended investment companies (OEICs). They share many traits in that the price of a fund always reflects the value of its holdings. They are more widely used even though some are more expensive than the Investment Trust alternatives.

The great advantages of open-ended funds are their flexibility to make more units, as well as the fact there are more funds available. This differs from a closed-ended fund, which issues a fixed number of non-redeemable shares like an Investment Trust. Over the last few decades most new fund launches in the UK were OEICs.

#### Stockbroking accounts

Stockbroking is typically offered by wellestablished companies advertising their services in print and online. Most countries have options although there are some major global providers who will allow accounts to be opened without some of the frequent country specific problems.

This option is a cost-efficient approach to investment, usually allowing access to any listed investment instruments on the main exchanges worldwide. The standard service provides accounts on an execution only basis, so no advice is offered, and you just have access to an account to purchase investments through based on your own choice.

#### **General investment accounts**

A General Investment Account (GIA) offers access to investment funds, and some direct securities (this is company specific). This is a common UK method of personal investment

Some international providers allow accounts to be established by Thailand residents (on a case-by-case basis). A limited number of UK account providers will allow this. It's a competitive marketplace currently so these accounts are generally cost efficient with the standard annual product charge in the region of 0.25% per annum. As they are mostly used by advisory companies GIAs aren't frequently used for personal execution only investment.

## Offshore life assurance investment bonds

This method is used regularly by offshore advisers. This product allows investment in the main currencies and listed investments through most dealing exchanges. For non-UK residents the more complicated UK taxation structure does not apply. For UK residents they are a tax deferral vehicle which is likely to have a UK tax liability after a certain period of time of withdrawals or at specific events. Whilst this approach can offer flexibility, the wide charging menu offered by most Offshore Bond providers can lead to an expensive product, upfront, ongoing and high surrender penalties in the early years.

They can be useful for estate planning as a few providers have their own trust companies providing off-the-shelf low-cost arrangements. As corporate trustees there's also a higher likelihood they will remain in place for the life of the arrangement.

#### **Discretionary portfolio management**

Historically these options are used by institutional investors, high net worth individuals, or charities. Most global asset management companies have high minimum investment levels and \$1 million is common, although a handful offer lower-level access, from \$500,000 upwards.

Discretionary Portfolios are managed without consulting you on investment decisions, with changes based on factors agreed at outset. They're usually cost efficient and available in most of the main currencies, although some have country specific criteria. They offer long term consistency and professional well-funded researched solutions.

#### Thailand tax information

Assessable income in Thailand includes the following categories:

#### **Capital gains**

Most types of capital gains are taxable as ordinary income. There are exemptions including the sale of shares in local listed companies and ASEAN member country stock exchanges. Capital gains and investment income earned by a resident from sources outside Thailand are currently not taxable unless remitted to Thailand and capital losses may not be offset against gains.

#### **Dividend income**

Dividends received from a company incorporated in Thailand are subject to withholding tax (WHT) at a flat rate of 10%. Offshore dividends are currently only taxable in Thailand if the value is remitted.

#### Interest income


Interest received from local bank deposits, as mentioned, is subject to withholding tax at a flat rate of 15%. Any offshore interest remitted into Thailand is liable to Thailand Tax at the prevailing rates with the possibility of a Tax Credit for any overseas tax paid.

With the changing Thailand tax landscape, it is essential you seek professional local tax advice from an appropriate locally listed and regulated organisation. Choosing the right investment approach for you is also highly important.

We continue the story of the British Club Bangkok ... **1978** 

#### "75th Anniversary!"

The 'British Club News' started off the anniversary year by printing a potted history of the Club's founding extracted from 'Twentieth century impressions of Siam' by Arnold Wright & Oliver T. Breakspear.

On July 7<sup>th</sup>, a Garden Cocktail Party was held to celebrate the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the opening of the first Clubhouse, at the other end of Suriwongse Road, but had to be rapidly moved to inside the Clubhouse as the heavens opened!

Also, in the July the Committee acknowledged that the picture in The Bar (now Veranda) of the old Clubhouse had been a gift from Club Member Charles Stewart (see Past Particle, August 2024). The prior year, his stamp agent had found a picture postcard of the old Clubhouse dated 28.05.1909 addressed to Mr R.W. Giblin announcing the sale of newspapers and periodicals. Ronald Worthy Giblin FRGS, born in Hobart, Tasmania, was a founding member of the Club, and Director of the Royal Survey Department of Siam. The postcard itself was donated to the Club a year later.

#### **Our Naval Year**

"You wait for ages, and they all come at once"... in March, during the only visit of the year, the Club extended use of our facilities to the crews of four naval visitors ...

These were HMAS Derwent (DE49), a River-class destroyer escort, on its fifth visit; and HMS Cleopatra (F28), a Leander-class frigate, on its second visit with HMS Rhyl (F129), a Rothesay-class anti-submarine frigate, and RFA Grey Rover (A269), a Rover class small fleet tanker.

#### The Law

We nearly fell foul of British Law ... the Club had used the holding of a British Passport as proof of being a British Citizen only to find out that such passports were being issued, for a number of reasons, under the Immigration Act 1971, to persons of Irish and Commonwealth nationality! Our policy changed to one which required the words 'right of abode' to be stamped in their British Passport ahead of being considered for 'ordinary' or 'country' membership.

We did fall foul of Thai Law, however .... we were fined in the January for not joining the Workman's Compensation Fund – this had come into force in 1974 but we seemed unaware of it.

In August, two drivers and a staff member were arrested for gambling on the premises, and in November we were fined again this time for failing to register our Chairman with the Police.

3.2 <u>Cambling.</u> The Manager reported that the police had arrested two drivers and a club employee for gambling on 31 August. The employee had been discharged from Club service.

#### The Long-Range Plan

The Long-Range Plan approved, but stalled, in 1977 started to come to life after the Chartered Bank agreed to loan the Club 1,000,000 Baht, authorised by a motion at the AGM.

In the May, the Clubhouse entrance was closed to allow a ramp and steps to be introduced, such that Clubhouse access was temporarily limited to the side door!

During both May and June, to allow for the refitting of the Dining Room (in 2024, the Churchill Bar), lunches were served in the Reading Room (in 2024, the Pool Room). In turn, all periodicals were placed upstairs in the Cinema Room (in 2024, the Suriwongse Room).

A one-storey Stores, Bakery and Main Kitchen extension was opened in the December onto the side of the Clubhouse.

As most members will have noted work has begun on the Dining Room renovations; the Reading Room is being used temporarily to serve lanches; and books, magazines and newspapers have been lodged in the Cinema Room. We hope that things will return to normal in early July.

During this month a ramp will be constructed at the Clubhouse entrance so that when the rains come passengers will no longer have to wade through ankle-deep water or negotiate stepping stones.

Mr. David Sprout served as Honorary Treasurer, in his only term of service, however, he went Absent in the August. The role of Honorary Treasurer then went to freshly co-opted member, Mr. Roy Barrett in the first of seven terms of service, mostly as Honorary Treasurer but also a part term as Vice-Chairman and one and a part terms as Chairman.

Continuing their service were Mr. Tom L. Barratt who would serve six terms [see Past Particle, September 2023]; Mr. Arthur W. Hawtin [see Past Particle, October 2024]; and Mr. Brian Heath [see Past Particle, July 2024]. Mr. John P.D. Gandy from the previous year was co-opted in the September but went Absent in the December.

#### Club News

The magazine noted a visit by Geoffrey Boycott, the England Cricketer "at the end of March" but contained no other details.

On 31st March, a Māori Concert Group from Singapore visited the Club, which as a consequence held a Family Night with discotheque for the children plus Pub Night in the Bar.

In the July, the 'English Ladies Golf Union' was renamed the 'British Club Ladies Golf'.

In the September, the General Committee agreed to set up a 'Ladies Advisory Committee' to advise and assist with Club affairs and entertainment.

The addition of 10 Associate members, the expansion of core nationality to Australian, Canadian and New Zealand citizens plus a strong recruitment drive amongst the Embassies did its job ... membership at the year-end rose to 447, an increase of 15% over the previous year. The Club thus ended the year one member short of its previous membership record of 448 in 1973!

Finally, in December the Club Manager, Lt. Col. (Retd) John F. Davis, gave notice that he would resign sometime early in the new year, and be holidaying in the UK for a month before finally leaving. The search for his replacement thus started.

#### In Other News

Gordon Albert Jockel became the Australian Ambassador at the beginning of the year and became an Honorary Member of the Club in the March.

John Peter Tripp CMG became the British Ambassador in the April, and became an Honorary Member of the Club in the May. At the same time, Commander C.D. Croft RN became the British Air & Naval Attaché and also joined the Club in the May.

Some sources state that the Chokchai International Tower, in Sukhumvit, overtook Silom's Dusit Thani Hotel as Bangkok's tallest building in this year, others credit the Royal Orchid Sheraton. The title was to return to Silom a few years later either way. Whilst the Royal Orchid Sheraton still remains, the Chokchai International Tower was demolished in 2017, and rebuilt as UOB Plaza which opened in 2022.

In the November, the municipality of Pattaya became a self-administrating city within the Changwat (Province) of Chonburi.

The 1978 Asian Games ran in Bangkok between 9th and 20th December ... after Singapore withdrew from hosting the games.



# Cercle Munster, Luxembourg

Reviewed by Paul Doust after a visit in September 2024 by Prasit Jangkamol (a.k.a. Jack)

The <u>Cercle Munster</u> in Luxembourg was founded in 1982 by a group of entrepreneurs. They thought that Luxembourg needed a top quality club for senior professionals and representatives of the city's international institutions, and modelled it on the gentleman's clubs in found in London, Bangkok and elsewhere. New members, both men and women, must be proposed and seconded by existing members and subsequently approved by the Admissions Committee. Renovation was required after the premises were acquired, so it wasn't until 1984 that the club was finally ready to welcome members. Renovation then continued, the first milestone being in 1993 when the 2nd floor was ready for inauguration. More recently, a new brasserie and wine lounge were opened in 2018.

The club premises are in the historic Grund district of Luxembourg beside the Alzette River. That was a problem in 2021 because the club was affected by the **severe flooding** that occurred in several European countries. The ground floor was flooded to a depth of over a metre, as shown in one of the pictures.





















This club takes great pride in its wine, advertising "an outstanding wine cellar" near the top of its home page on its website. The cellar contains around 1,500 distinguished labels and some 40,000 bottles. The staff had to work hard to protect the wine during the flooding. The wine list is a thick tome, and the scale of the cellar is such that the great majority of the labels are available for purchase to drink off-site.

The <u>Cercle Munster</u> is open Monday to Friday and on Saturday evenings. Apart from the brasserie and wine lounge, the club's facilities include a gastronomic restaurant, a bar, a veranda, a terrace, and a smoking area in the attic. A lot of function rooms are available for private dinners and business meetings too. The club also has a library which is used for various events, and which is where bridge and chess are played. Before 5pm men are required to wear a shirt and jacket, with ties required after 5pm. The club has no accommodation.

Two months ago Jack was travelling through Luxembourg, so he took the opportunity to have dinner at the <u>Cercle Munster</u>. In advance of his visit, the club was very responsive to our email enquiries, so a dinner was booked in the gastronomic restaurant on a Friday evening. On arrival, a staff member gave him a brief tour, and told him a bit about the club. There was a big event in the club's function rooms on the night that Jack visited, but nonetheless he was reasonably well looked after in the restaurant. In particular, the head Sommelier Mangin Denis was very helpful. After dinner the bar was empty, but there were staff in the wine lounge so he retired there, and he was able to settle the entire bill there at the end of the night.

The overall impression was of a very accommodating and comfortable club, so it's a good club for British Club members to have access to in Luxembourg, especially for members who enjoy drinking good wine.








#### **EVENT REPORT:**

#### A Thai Food Masterclass from Celebrity Chef McDang: 26th September 2024

Section Chairperson Terry Adams introduced Mom Luang Sirichalerm Svasti, born into the Thai Royal Family, who is popularly known as Chef McDang, Thailand's Celebrity Chef. He is very much known as the 'oracle' as regards Thai cuisine, its history including the various regional differences, and for his ground-breaking work to highlight the complexities of taste and senses involved in Thai cuisine.

Chef had brought with him very fresh examples of key herbs and spices used in Thai cookery. He chopped and/ or hammered these, which were passed around the very attentive audience for each to savour the different aromas, as he took us through his 'Principles of Thai Cookery' presentation. He explained to us with superb slides the influences of fat, salinity, sweetness and sourness. He then highlighted key herbs and spices before



discussing the importance of paste in Thai cuisine, following which he then introduced the key nine 'essential' ingredients and explained how they are interlinked.

Moving on to Thailand's food history he took us through the Sukhothai Era and in more detail the important Ayutthaya Era where Portuguese and Chinese interaction and influence facilitated massive additions to Thai ingredients, food, and cookery techniques, through to the Rattanakosin Era. He then discussed the various regional differences before turning to the history of Thai Desserts before, during, and after the King Narai The Great period, finishing on the structure of Thai cookery's various cooking techniques.

This was a true 'Masterclass' given by a consummate professional, as attested by the reality that all the globally recognized chefs when visiting Thailand, seek to cook with Chef McDang and to learn from him.

### **EVENT REPORT:**

### A Croquet & Boules Match against the Young Happy Organisation: 10th October 2024

















All was in hand on the Club's front lawn from freshly cut grass to the croquet hoops and peg already in place for action to begin. # **BRIDGE** SECTION
















# TENNIS

## **New Look, New Courts at the British Club**



Good news for all the tennis folk. Before the end of this year, you could be playing on beautiful courts as shown here. Resurfacing of the courts will be between 2-25 December 2024 so Boxing Day tennis may be possible. These are special courts with CSS CoolTop that incorporates new Cool pigment technology which reduces the amount of energy absorbed by the surface, and hence the surface temperature. A range pigments have been identified which reflect light in the infrared range. So, we will have blue courts with green around the outside.

### Tributes to a Tennis Player and Dear Friend


